MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

The West Valley Water District (District) currently operates ten (10) pressurized vessels that contain granular activated carbon (GAC) at the Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility for total organic carbon (TOC) removal. TOC reacts with chlorine, a commonly used drinking water disinfectant, and forms disinfection byproducts in the distribution system. The goal of the GAC is to reduce the TOC levels to limit the levels of known and unknown disinfection byproducts which may have adverse health effects.

District staff has identified a need to replace the GAC in the ten (10) vessels. Common GAC products are made from coconut shell, coal, and wood products. The selection of carbon sources is driven by contaminant reduction performance. Coconut shell carbons tend to have a higher percentage of micro-pores making it a good choice for groundwater treatment with trace levels of organic compounds and disinfection byproducts. Wood carbons have more macro-pores making them better for de-colorization and removal of larger organics. Coal bases give an intermediate pore structure making them a good choice for purification of surface water treatment for TOC removal, taste and odor contaminant removal and per- and polyfluoroalkyl substance (PFAS) treatment.

DISCUSSION:

On June 2, 2025, a Request for Bids (RFB) was issued and publicly advertised on PlanetBids. Three (3) firms – Calgon Carbon Corporation, Kabonous, Inc., and Carbon Activated Corp. – submitted bids to provide the specified services. The project includes the purchase, removal and disposal of existing GAC and placement of new coal-based GAC. Attached as **Exhibit A** is the project summary. The three bids were as follows:

FISCAL IMPACT:

This item is included in the Fiscal Year 2024/25 Capital Budget titled "GAC Vessel Media Replacement" with a budget of \$1,300,000.00.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to approve an agreement with Calgon Carbon Corporation for GAC media replacement in the amount of \$671,060.00.

Granular Activated Carbon (GAC) Media Replacement

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility (WFF) located at 3010 N. Cedar Ave. in the City of Rialto needs to replace Granular Activated Carbon in ten (10) GAC vessels that holds 40,000 pounds each. The treatment system is from Calgon model 12-40. The GAC supplier(s) will remove the spent GAC media and haul it away and replace it with new bituminous GAC media 12 by 40 mesh coal base carbon.

All treatment carbon replacement work must be performed by experienced technicians working under the observation of WVWD. The GAC Supplier shall provide all labor, equipment, and materials required to perform the following:

- Remove spent carbon using slurry techniques to place media directly into trucks. Haul removed carbon to licensed facility for thermal destruction or reactivation. Provide manifests and certificates documenting thermal destruction or reactivation of spent carbon.
- Inspect and photograph empty vessel(s); identify any equipment damage or service requirements. Replace seals as necessary. Provide photographs to WVWD. [Note: costs for seal replacement or other internal vessel rehabilitation need not be included at this time].
- Hose down the inside of the empty vessel using water from the nearby municipal hydrant. Flush all wash waters from the GAC vessels to the adjacent decant ponds.
- Deliver and load pre-washed new GAC (12 x 40 mesh coal bae carbon) in the treatment vessels as a slurry.
- Backwash loaded GAC to stratify the bed and remove fines until visually clear water is produced to WVWD's satisfaction. Fines shall be retained on Supplier's slurry trailer. Water that's been treated by Supplier's trailer for best management practices for solid and color removal may be discharged to adjacent decant ponds.
- Pressurize the GAC vessels and verify proper operation.
- Chemically test the "loaded" vessel and verify the absence of bacteria.
- If bacteria are detected in the loaded vessel, conduct carbon sanitization using pH adjustment techniques. Sanitization additives shall be identified before work begins, may not be employed without WVWD's approval. Chemicals used to remove bacteria shall be neutralized and shall be removed from the vessels and discharged to the adjacent waste pit. Vessel shall then be retested to verify the absence of bacteria.
- All GAC vessels could be shut down at any given time. Loading these vessels would take approximately 2-3 days.
- The material does not need to be domestically manufactured as most of the GAC media come from overseas. The GAC shall be NSF certified and meet SWRCB's requirements. WVWD has never used agglomerated coal before.
- The pre-wash step means the firm shall wet and wash the carbon on site to remove fines. The spent backwash water can go into the decant ponds.
- Once the vessels are loaded with the new GAC, the firm shall hook up filtering system to remove fines from the carbon. This step helps to keep the backwash basin clean.
- WVWD is responsible for sampling the vessels.

Responsibility of Carbon Supplier:

- 1. Supply of 40,000 lbs. of virgin activated carbon per vessel (i.e., 200,000 lbs. total), per specifications as defined below.
- 2. Delivery of virgin carbon to customer site in bulk slurry trailers dedicated to food grade/potable water service. Trailers must be sanitized by food grade wash-out prior to carbon loading for potable water contact. Food-grade washout certificates to be provided to WVWD upon request.
- 3. On-site supervision and removal of spent carbon from vessel absorbers via slurry transfer, and fill of absorbers with virgin carbon via slurry transfer. Backwash loaded GAC to stratify the bed and remove fines until visually clear water is produced to WVWD's satisfaction. Fines shall be retained on Supplier's slurry trailer. Water that's been treated by the supplier's trailer for solid and color removal may be discharged into adjacent decant ponds.
- 4. Compressed air supply.
- 5. Coordinate use of adjacent potable water hydrant with WVWD.
- 6. Transportation of spent carbon from the customer's site to destruction or reactivation facility with proper non-hazardous manifest. No bill of ladings allowed.
- 7. Destruction or reactivation of the spent carbon at a properly permitted facility.
- 8. Supply of certificate of thermal destruction or reactivation within 30 days of WVWD's request.
- 9. Provide certified laboratory results to verify the absence of bacteria in loaded GAC.
- 10. Sanitize carbon as may be required to remove bacteria from GAC.

MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

In February 2023 the Board of Directors approved a \$3,000,000 construction contingency for the Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility Upgrade and Expansion project which was set aside for unexpected costs during construction. Construction contingency is a form of risk management used to avoid cutting costs, to keep the project's schedule on track and to ensure material and workmanship quality. It is also used to cover other costs such as:

- Unknown underground conflicts
- Unforseen conditions and services
- Owner-requested changes and/or design upgrades and modifications

Unexpected costs are inevitable on a project of this magnitude and within the current unpredictable construction/procurement environment. Identifying the need for the unexpected cost through a change order and managing them as they arise are key to the project's success.

To date, the District has approved 8 change orders to address project needs.

DISCUSSION:

The current contractual completion month for the project is June 2025 but supply chain challenges associated with the final two motor control centers has impacted the construction schedule, extending the expected project completion date to December 2025. This delay could result in the assessment of Liquidated Damages at the completion of the project against the Design-Builder. Staff notified the Design-Build team of the delay and offered to participate in negotiations to develop a Recovery Plan to ensure the project is completed successfully.

A Recovery Plan is a risk management tool for Owners to address contractual disputes with Design-Build partners. Recovery Plans are a process identified by Design Build Institute of America as a best practice to identify project challenges, develop solutions, and implement them to ensure projects are completed successfully.

Through negotiations, staff and the Design Build partner have proposed a solution that would extend the contract duration by 209 days to reflect a December 2025 project completion date in exchange for work already performed or soon to be performed that were change conditions in addition to allowances for future change conditions.

Attached as Exhibit A is Change Order 9 for the above reference project. This change order includes extra items of work arising from existing paving conditions, operations requests, landscaping improvements, work schedule modifications, allowances, and minor miscellaneous items. A brief description of the recommended changes included in the change order is provided below:

- 1. <u>Paving Revisions</u>: Following construction and trenching of treatment plant roadways, it was identified that the current pavement did not meet current high traffic roadway requirements. The Design Builder proposed a solution that would replace the current roadways with an improved pavement section in high traffic areas and slurry seal the light traffic areas. This solution will provide a uniform looking pavement in the treatment plant and be an improvement to the current pavement design.
- <u>Operator Requests</u>: As the project is nearing completion and items are being constructed Operation and District Staff are better able to identify project additions that were not readily apparent during the design phase of the project. These requests include: 1) planter box relocations, 2) sink replacements, 3) wall mounted analyzer relocations, and 4) addition of a trash enclosure.
- 3. <u>Landscaping Improvements</u>: Following rain events this year it was identified that the current landscape design along Riverside Avenue would benefit from bender board to separate decomposed granite from mulched areas. This item would install the bender board and perform other small improvements to help with the long-term maintainability of the roadway frontage around the treatment plant.
- 4. <u>Work Schedule Modifications</u>: During the construction of the project the Design- Builder began work on Recovery Ponds 1-4, consistent with their approved project schedule. However, during that work, the Recovery Ponds 5 and 6 Return Pumps experienced a mechanical failure, to maintain plant operations and continue construction progress, staff requested the Design-Builder to modify the work schedule to complete Pond 5 and 6 first. This change in schedule resulted in additional costs for trade staff expediting the pond work.
- 5. <u>Allowances</u>: As the project nears completion and Operations staff begin to operate the installed upgrades, several small items are being identified that could be improved. Recognizing the main Programmable Logic Controller cut over still remains and commissioning activities need to occur for most of the installed upgrades, it is expected that future changes will likely be needed to complete the project. This item will provide staff with the tools to address any needed changes quickly. If these allowances are not used by the end of the project, staff will request a credit back from the Design-Builder which could be withheld from the retention release.
- 6. <u>Minor Miscellaneous Items</u>: An existing bypass valve at the hydro-electric generation was previously only operable from the plant control system, this work modified a local control panel with status feedback for local manual control to be installed by the Design-Builder.

This change order adds 209 of excusable but non-compensable time to reflect the current proposed contract duration, with an expected completion date of December 25, 2025 and 67 allowable Plant shutdown days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The added cost to perform the additional work as outlined in Change Order No. 9 is \$0 and has no net financial impact on the contract amount with PCL. The existing construction contingency which remains at \$1,750,840 and is available for any future change orders, if needed.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Staff recommends that the Committee forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to:

- 1. Approve Change Order No. 9 with PCL Construction, Inc. adding 209 days of excusable but noncompensable time to the allowable contract duration and 67 allowable Scheduled Plant Shutdown days to the contract.
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute all necessary documents.

DISCUSSION

Attached as Exhibit A is Change Order No. 9 for the above referenced project. This change order includes "extra" items of work arising from unforeseen condition conflicts with proposed improvements, lack of accurate as-built records and/or malfunctioning existing equipment, and owner requested changes. These items will be provided to the West Valley Water District at no change and a time extension will be granted to PCL until the end of the project. A brief description of the recommended changes included in the change order is provided below:

1. Paving Revisions: Following construction and trenching of treatment plant roadways, it was identified that the current pavement did not meet current high traffic roadway requirements. The Design Builder proposed a solution that would replace the current roadways with an improved pavement section in high traffic areas and slurry seal the light traffic areas. This solution will provide a uniform looking pavement in the treatment plant and be an improvement to the current pavement design.

This change in schedule resulted in additional costs for trades staff expediting the Ponds 5 and 6 work.

5. Allowances: As the project nears completion and Operations staff begin to operate the installed upgrades several small items are being identified that could be improved. Recognizing the main Programable Logic Controller cutover still remains and commissioning activities need to occur for most of the installed upgrades it is expected that future changes will likely be needed to complete the project. This item will provide staff with the tools to address any needs changes quickly. If these allowances are not used by the end of the project, staff will request a credit back from the Design-Builder which could be withheld from the Retention Release.

6. Minor Miscellaneous Items: An existing bypass valve at the hydro-electric generation was previously only operable from the plant control system, this work modified a local control panel with status feedback for local manual control to be installed by the Design-Builder.

Time impacts to the project schedule result from this change order. The impact allows for a schedule extension to December 25, 2025.

Mr. Hermann and Mr. Rocky,

Please accept the attached package as a Change Request, addressing the cost impacts associated with unforeseen conditions encountered during the paving work inside the facility.

It was brought to our attention when we had the paving contractor conduct a pre-walk that the existing pavement inside the plant does not have the thickness required in order to achieve a successful 2" grind and overlay. At least a 4" minimum existing asphalt thickness is recommended and currently the majority of the existing pavement is below 4". It was also discovered that the existing asphalt only has native soil not a structural base underneath. The District has accepted the current existing conditions and the approach of paving over existing native soil.

This was communicated and confirmed with GHD on 4/16/2025. This issue only affects original contract areas scoped for a grind and overlay. Areas that would receive new structural base and asphalt pavement were not affected and this work proceeded as scheduled on 4/17/2025. This existing paving scope was not touched since it was still being discussed. The paving contractor demobilized 5/2/2025 and will return once the final scope is clarified. Remobilization fees will not be charged to the District.

Several discussions and walks with GHD, Stantec, and the District have taken place to provide the best cost-effective alternatives for the paving change in scope. Scope proposals were sent on 4/25/2025, 5/16/2025, and now this latest revision with the credits listed below.

Credits:

- 1. The District was owed a 2" grind and pave for all the existing asphalt. The complete line item value of \$194,340 is being discounted since this scope is no longer feasible. This was intended to be done in conjunction with the 6" slot patch for trench restorations in existing asphalt, see below.
- 2. The District was owed a 6" thick restoration for all trenched areas in existing asphalt pavement. The complete line item value of \$11,340 is being discounted since this scope is no longer of interest since the new proposition is to remove and replace 4" from grade. The bottom 2" of the 6" from the original scope was already provided as structural base by PCL, and will remain in place, however the entire line item of 6" will be refunded to the District in good faith and for practical estimating purposes. PCL finds it noteworthy that only 1,080 SF of trench

repairs was estimated for the project, and in actuality over 4000 SF of structural trench repair was provided due to design growth.

3. There are some areas that were identified with an unusually thick asphalt. These would have been candidates for a 2" grind and pave, however due to the more than anticipated trenching, it was not productive to perform a 2" grind and pave for only that area. PCL is issuing a \$31,336 credit for this area identified in a green shade between the Chemical Building and Pre-Treatment. This was done in good faith, and to remain consistent with what was offered at the start of conversations, since this credit is technically already being issued in Credits 1 & 2. Ultimately, this area is being proposed for a 4" removal as replacement.

Credits 1 & 2 scopes accounted for conditions based on a sufficient asphalt thickness and assumed structural type media underneath the existing asphalt. In light of the new existing conditions the scopes of Credits 1 & 2 are no longer applicable and have been removed, bringing the scope back to zero for the existing asphalt areas. Building a new scope moving forward are the areas shaded Pink and Blue. Yellow shaded areas is scope completed under original contract or approved change order work, not affecting the Credit 1 & 2 line items. Latest prices are based on full credit of removed scope that will not be completed and full price of new scope that is to be completed. Below is a list of the new proposed scopes.

New Proposed Scopes:

- A. Option A (REJECTED): Full removal and replacement of all existing asphalt. This option would combine both the pink and blue areas for full removal of the top 4" of mixed material and replacement with a new 4" layer of asphalt over existing native soil. The total for this option is \$291,158.39, including credits to the District.
- B. Option B (SELECTED): An alternate to full removal and replacement of the same aforementioned areas includes substituting the blue areas for a slurry seal only instead of full replacement. The entire existing asphalt was assessed, and due to minimum deterioration and wear, lower-trafficked blue areas were identified as good candidates for a slurry only option. Within the blue areas there will be some minor local patches to 4" of replaced material, approximating 600 SF, and these areas will also be slurried over. Pink areas are still recommended for full replacement. The total for this option is \$98,090.16, including credits to the District.

Stantec determined that long lifespan of asphalt is typically correlated with a strong structural base layer. Other factors are also at play, which affect the lifespan of asphalt are weather, traffic, asphalt mix etc. Historically, there are areas of existing asphalt that are in significantly better condition than expected given the native soil layer. For the 2 options provided, allowing native soil as the structural layer, full asphalt replacement will result in the longest expected lifespan.

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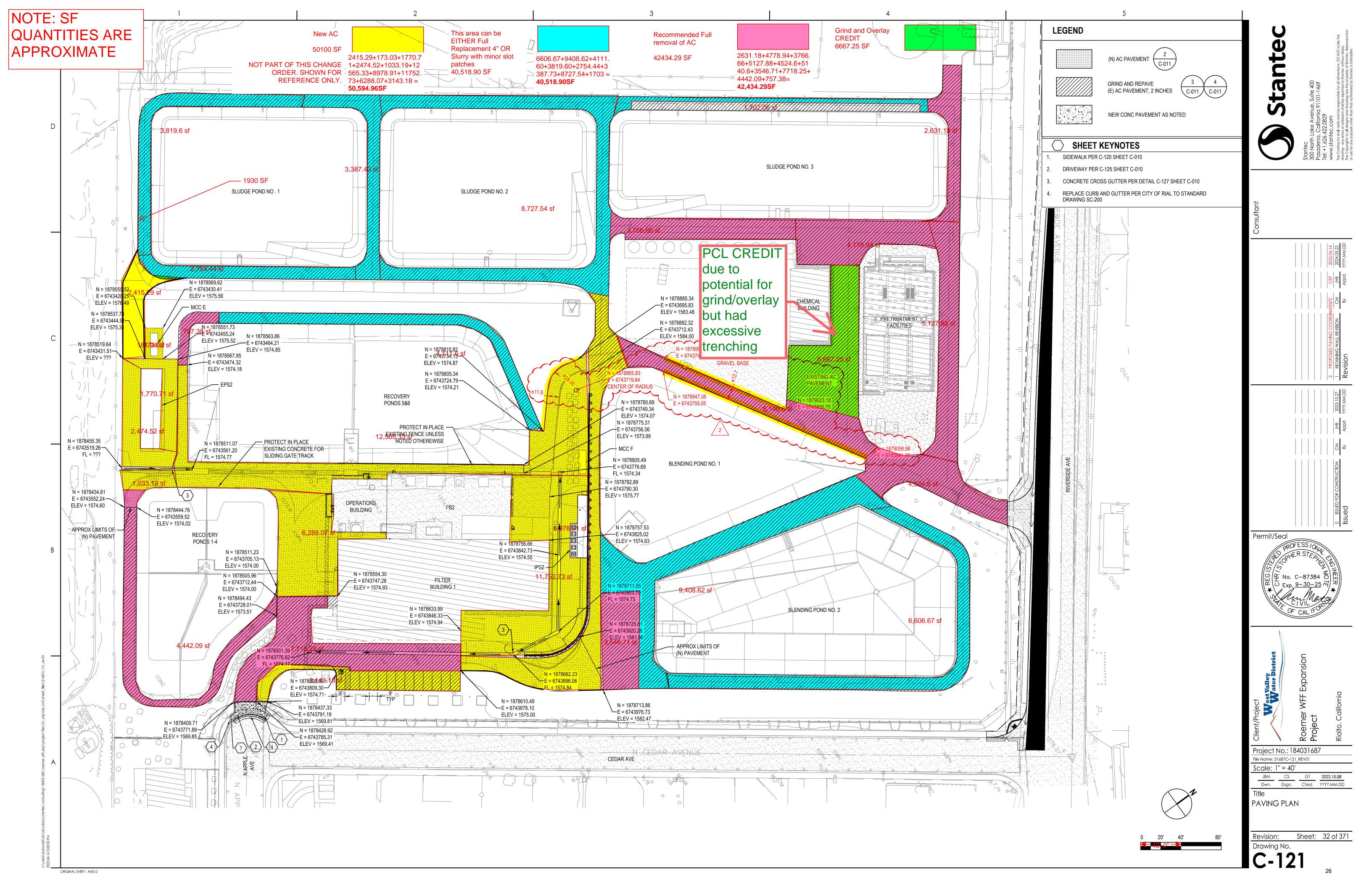

Please accept the attached package as a Change Request to bring Pump #1 and #2 at Recovery Pond 1-4 back into service due to the failure of the existing Pump #3 and #4 at Recovery Pond 5&6 on 2/13/2025 after PCL and LEED had already commenced demolition of the above ground pipe and electrical wires at Pond 1-4. Per WVWD's request to bring Pump #1 and #2 at Pond 1-4 back online, PCL and LEED have reallocated resources on 2/13/2025 to work on the needed tasks including re-pulling wire from the hand hole at East of the Ponds and re-installing the mechanical discharge piping associated with Pump #1 and #2. During the commissioning of the hydrostation it was discovered that there is no way to manually open the valve that would permit a bypass of the influent water from the hydrostation to the plant. The bypass currently only works with SCADA. Operations would like to add a manual override in the scenario where SCADA is non responsive. This will allow water to feed the plant regardless of SCADA and or hydrostation activity using a manual method. LEED has verbally provided an estimate for T&M of under 1k, this does not include markup.

MEETING HISTORY:

BACKGROUND:

GHD, Inc. (GHD) has been providing Professional Engineering Services to the District for the Oliver P. Roemer Water Filtration Facility Expansion Project, including project/construction management, site inspection services, and other engineering services during construction. Additionally, GHD and it's teaming partners prepared the 30% design documents, assisting the District with the Design Build Team selection/onboarding.

GHD has been acting as the "Owner's Agent" for the construction phase of the Project. GHD's responsibilities as the Owners Agent are to review all the of the Design Builders work product, oversee construction, commissioning activities, post construction tasks and warranty phase to ensure successful completion of the project. The services being provided by GHD include:

- Construction Management (full time onsite presence via resident engineer)
- Project Management
- Submittal Reviews,
- Requests for Information Management and Response
- Change Order and Progress Payment Management

- Permitting and Compliance items
- Commissioning Support
- Project Closeout Planning and Support
- Acceptance Testing coordination
- Poset Construction and Warranty Phase support

The nature of an Owner's Agent role is driven by the schedule and activities of the Design Build partner and often requires quick decisions on items that could not have been foreseen when the original professional services agreement was developed. The current PSA with GHD includes a "burn rate and schedule approach" to ensure adequate and timely oversight of the Design Build partner, which assumed a project completion of approximately July 2025.

DISCUSSION:

In March of 2025 the Design Build Partner informed the District and GHD of a supply chain delay related to Motor Control Center components that will delay the completion of the Project until December 2025. This delay is being addressed with the Design Build Partner separately. However, the District still requires GHD's services as the Owner's Agent throughout the completion of the project.

GHD has prepared a proposal describing the anticipated Owner's Agent Services to complete the Project, that proposal is included in the attached **Exhibit A**-Draft Amendment to Task Order 1. GHD is proposing a fee that includes a monthly burn rate of \$85,000 per month, with limited services during the months of August and September, when construction activities are expected to be minimal, and resuming until the completion of the project.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost to continue to perform the construction management and various other engineering services during construction as presented in the Task Order Amendment is \$496,250.00. Sufficient funds are available in the project budget under W19041 to cover the proposed additional services.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to:

- 1. Approve an Amendment to Task Order Number 1 for an amount not-to-exceed \$496,250.00 with GHD Inc. for the Oliver P. Roemer WFF Upgrade and Expansion Project and;
- 2. Authorize the General Manger to Execute all necessary documents.

MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

The Lord Ranch Site (Site) is located on the east side of Pepper Avenue, between Baseline Road and the 210 Freeway, in the City of Rialto. This Site is currently occupied by Pump Station 4-1, Reservoir 3-2, and Groundwater Wells 7, 8A, and 36. The West Valley Water District (District) proposes to construct several infrastructure improvements at the Site to increase operational capacity through the Base Line Feeder (BLF) transmission pipeline. The BLF delivers purchase groundwater from the San Bernardino Valley Municipal Water District, which is then boosted into the District's norther service area.

The proposed project includes the construction and operation of a 1-million-gallon aeration tank (R3-5), and a new booster pump station (PS4-3), which will be housed within a concrete masonry building. Pipelines will be installed to connect the new facilities to the existing infrastructure on-site. Site grading and drainage improvements (Site Improvements) will also be completed to support the new construction and improve overall site functionality.

Additional improvements include the installation of new pumps and motors, a ventilation system, an emergency standby generator with a fuel tank and day tank, site and building electrical including a switchboard and motor control center. The project will also incorporate a Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) System and Instrumentation, as well as provisions for equipment testing, system start-up, and the development of an operations and maintenance manual. Further work includes the installation of perimeter wrought iron fencing, site grading, paving, and modifications to the existing drainage system piping that serves the existing reservoir. Collectively, these improvements will enhance the District's ability to reliably deliver water to its northern service area and increase system resilience.

Staff contracted with a design consultant to prepare a Request for Bids for the Lord Ranch Facilities Project, which was advertised on PlanetBids to General Contractors.

DISCUSSION:

As part of the bidding process, a mandatory pre-bid job walk was conducted to provide prospective contractors with an overview of the project scope and site conditions. The job walk was well-attended, with fifteen contractors and subcontractors participating. Following the job-walk, the District received six (6) formal bids for the project. A summary of the bids received is presented in the table below for reference.

After the receipt of bids staff identified a perimeter fencing improvement to increase site security by installing a welded wire mesh fencing panel as opposed to the traditional tubular wrought iron panels. Caliagua provided a cost for the upgraded fencing that would increase the bid amount by \$238,260.00.

A copy of the received bid from Caliagua is attached as **Exhibit A** to this staff report.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This project is included in the five-year funding schedule for the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Budget. Sufficient funds have been allocated within the project budget to cover the anticipated costs.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to:

- 1. Approve a Construction Contract with Caliagua Inc. in the amount of \$13,367,660.00 for the Lord Ranch Facilities Project (W15003, 15004, and W15006); and
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute all necessary documents.

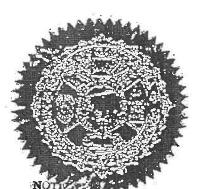

MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

On March 20, 2025, West Valley Water District ("District") entered into an Agreement with Merlin Johnson Construction, Inc. ("Contractor") for the construction of the 18-inch Transmission Main Crossing Ontario I-15 Freeway Project ("Project"). The Project was designed to install a new 18-inch (18") water pipeline approximately 580 linear feet, connecting to an existing 18" transmission main at Lytle Creek Road, bore under the Ontario I-15 freeway with a 36" steel casing within Caltrans right-of-way, and terminate at Citrus Avenue in anticipation of the future development within the area.

DISCUSSION:

On May 14, 2025, during a utility potholing in the areas adjacent to the freeway, the Contractor encountered boulders in the size of 30" in diameter. The designed steel casing was intended to bore through rocks that are about 12" in diameter. Given the large-size boulders observed at the project site, the following changes were recommended by the Contractor:

- Increasing the steel casing size from 36" to 48" in diameter.
- Hand-mining, in lieu of boring, underneath across the freeway to install the steel casing.

Based on the past project experience, boring equipment would likely be damaged and the boring path would be deflected or altered when encountering large-size (30" or larger) boulders. Hand-mining method is expected to require an additional 74 calendar days to complete the crossing of the freeway but is considered the most efficient and cost-effective approach with the given field condition.

• Replacing spacers with redwood skids to support the 18" water pipeline at the center of the steel casing. This material change will reduce the project cost by \$58,000.

After further review and discussion with the design consultant and a third-party boring-specialized contractor, Staff determined that the recommended method is the most cost-effective approach in completing the project successfully.

The expected construction duration will be extended by 74 calendar days for a total of 254 calendar days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This Project was included in the Fiscal Year 2024/2025 Capital Improvement Budget under Project No. W21007 Zone 7 – 18" Transmission Main Crossing Ontario I-15 Freeway Project. Additional funds will be allocated in the Fiscal Year 2025/2026 Capital Improvement Budget for project completion.

This change order will increase the contract amount by \$583,015, for a total of \$1,912,490.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to:

- 1. Approve Change Order No. 1 in the amount of \$583,015 with Merlin Johnson Construction, Inc. for the construction of the 18-inch Transmission Main Crossing Ontario I-15 Freeway Project and;
- 2. Authorize the General Manager to execute all necessary documents.

III. JUSTIFICATION:

Item No. 1: 36" diameter steel casing will only work if the underground rocks are in the size of 12" diameter or less. Based on the observation during utility potholing, the boulders in the area can be 30" or larger which requires hand-mining through a 48" diameter casing.

Item No. 2: Given the large size of the boulders in the area, the auger would likely be damaged during boring and the boring path may be deflected or altered when encountering large boulders. Hand-mining method would be the most efficient and cost-effective approach in the given field condition. Hand-mining would require an additional 74 calendar days to complete the project.

Item No. 3: Spacers can be replaced with redwood skids to support the 18" water pipeline in the center of the steel casing during installation. This material change will result in a credit of \$58,000.

MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

Currently, a portion of the water distribution system in Bloomington - including mains, service lines, and valves, are located within the rear alleyways behind residential properties. Over the years, the construction of fences and buildings in the alleyway has restricted WVWD's ability to access meters, locate shut-off valves, and perform both routine and emergency maintenance activities.

To resolve these access limitations and improve overall system reliability, WVWD proposes the construction of approximately 4,400 linear feet of 8-inch and 4,000 linear feet of 24-inch cement-lined, mortar-coated, fully welded steel pipeline within the public right-of-way. The pipeline installation will occur along 8th Street, between Locust and Cedar Avenue, and along Maple Avenue, between 7th and 8th Street. The project also includes the relocation of 106 service laterals from the rear alleyways to the front of the associated properties, the installation of 11 new fire hydrants, and the connections of the new pipelines to existing waterlines within the paved right-of-way.

The District contracted with a design consultant to prepare the construction bid documents for Phase 3C. The Request for Bids was subsequently advertised through PlanetBids to contractors on the District's preapproved pipeline contractors list.

The West Valley Water District (WVWD), in partnership with San Bernardino County 5th District Supervisor Joe Baca Junior, has secured a \$1.5 million investment to support the Bloomington Alleyway Water Main Replacement Project – Phase 3C. This critical infrastructure project aims to enhance fire flow, improve emergency response capabilities, and provide a more dependable and reliable water supply for residents of Bloomington.

DISCUSSION:

As part of the bidding process, a mandatory pre-bid job walk was conducted to provide prospective contractors with an overview of the project scope and site conditions. The job walk was well-attended, with six (6) contractors participating. Following the job-walk, the District received four (4) formal bids for the project. A summary of the bids received is presented in the table below for reference.

As part of the bid schedule, staff identified an alternative bid item to grind and overlay the asphalt paving cap per the County of San Bernardino Department of Public Works requirements that the County may require following the completion of the work. TK Construction provided a cost for the alternative bid item that would increase the bid amount by \$217,397.61 if the County inspectors require the additional paving work following the project construction activities.

A copy of the received bid from TK Construction is included with the staff report as Exhibit A.

Staff also requested the design engineer, Albert A. Webb Associates (Webb), provide a proposal to perform engineering services during construction. These services will include traditional project management responsibilities of the Engineer of Record such as responding to requests for information from the Contractor and providing design intent responses. Webb has included these services in their proposal attached as Exhibit B.

The expected construction duration for the proposal is 240 working days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This project is included in the five-year funding schedule for the Fiscal Year 2025/26 Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) Budget. Sufficient funds have been allocated within the project budget to cover the anticipated costs. The recommended activities described in this staff report includes a construction contract award of \$4,859,432.32 plus the engineering services during construction contract of \$145,600.00, which are both within the CIP budget.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to:

- 1. Approve a Construction Contract with TK Construction in the amount of \$4,859,432.32 for the Bloomington Alleyway Water Main Replacement Project Phase 3C (W25037); and
- 2. Approve a New Task Order with Albert A. Webb Associates in the amount of \$145,600.00 for Engineering Services during construction for the project; and
- 3. Authorize the General Manager to execute all necessary documents.

1.3 KEY PROJECT ISSUES:

- 1. Safety
 - a. The project is located in an existing neighborhood
 - i. WEBB will ensure effective traffic control is in place following "CA MUTCD 2014 Edition, Rev 8".
 - ii. The WEBB Team will be active in encouraging safe practices. WEBB will reinforce the Contractor's requirement to provide adequate safety measures at each project meeting with the Contractor.

Services which are not specifically identified herein as services to be performed by WEBB Associates are considered Additional Services for the purposes of this Proposal. The District may request that WEBB Associates perform services which are Additional Services. WEBB

Associates will perform such additional services upon execution of an amendment to this Agreement setting forth the scope, schedule, and fee for such additional services.

2.5 EXCLUSIONS

Any work relating to the following is specifically excluded for the Construction Services proposed herein and, if required, must be contracted for under a separate contract or as an addendum to this contract:

- Full-time inspection
- Full-service Construction Management
- Welding Inspection
- Utility Potholing
- Soil and Material Testing
- Prepare Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plans (SWPPP)
- Permit and Payments
- Traffic Control Plans (by Contractor)
- Utility Relocation Plans
- Property Acquisition
- Any other work task not specifically in the Scope of Services.
- Operational Plan
- O & M Manuals

This proposal is based in part on the assumption that the District acknowledges that WEBB Associates is not responsible for the performance of work by third parties. Notwithstanding any other language contained herein, WEBB Associates, and its officers, directors, and employees, shall not be liable except to the extent that any Project damages are directly attributable to the actions of WEBB Associates.

SECTION 3 - COMPENSATION FOR SERVICES

3.1 FEE SUMMARY

WEBB is committed to providing services in a skillful, professional and competent manner consistent with the industry standards, practices and principles generally recognized as being employed by professionals in the same discipline in the County of San Bernardino and the State of California. STRATEGIC GOAL:

Strategic Goal 1 - Manage and Deliver a Safe, Reliable, and Sustainable Water Supply

A. Increase System Capacity for Anticipated Growth

MEETING HISTORY:

N/A

BACKGROUND:

HDO 4, LLC ("Developer") is the owner of land located south of Duncan Canyon Road, west of Citrus Avenue, along John Previti Avenue (formerly Lytle Creek Road) in the City of Fontana. The Developer has planned to construct the project in several phases, with each planning area containing multiple mixed-use residential and commercial products known collectively as Ventana ("Development"). In developing this land, new water mains and related facilities must be installed to allow for domestic, irrigation and fire connections to service the Development. More specifically, an extension of approximately 3,100 linear feet of 12-inch ductile iron pipe will need to be installed from the project's northern Duncan Canyon Road frontage to its southern property line on Lytle Creek Road.

DISCUSSION:

West Valley Water District ("District") and the Developer wish to enter into a Developer-Installed Water System Infrastructure Installation and Conveyance Agreement ("Agreement") to construct the water facilities needed to supply water to the Development. This Agreement outlines the responsibilities of the Developer in constructing facilities, including insurance, indemnification and bonding requirements as well as conveyance and acceptance of the water system by the District. Included as **Exhibit A** is a copy of the Water System Infrastructure Installation and Conveyance Agreement for this development which also includes the location of the Development.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact to the District.

REQUESTED ACTION:

Forward a recommendation to the Board of Directors to approve the Water System Infrastructure Installation and Conveyance Agreement with HDO 4, LLC for John Previti Ave (Ventana South) Improvements

WATER SYSTEM INFRASTRUCTURE INSTALLATION AND CONVEYANCE AGREEMENT

This water system infrastructure installation and conveyance agreement ("Agreement") is entered into and effective as of ______ by and between **HDO 4**, **LLC** ("Developer"), and WEST VALLEY WATER DISTRICT ("District") who agree as follows:

The Developer is the owner of certain land described as **The Ventana** and as more fully (or further) shown on <u>Exhibit "A"</u>. In developing this land, the Developer is desirous of obtaining a public water supply adequate for domestic uses and public fire protection purposes and is desirous of integrating that water system into the District's public water system.

In order to provide facilities for a water supply to said land, it is the intention of the parties to this Agreement that the Developer shall furnish and install those water mains, fire hydrants, service laterals, water meters and valves, valve boxes, and all other appurtenant fittings and facilities required for a complete water system to serve the land shown on <u>Exhibit "A"</u>.

In order to implement the foregoing and in consideration of the terms and conditions herein contained, the parties further agree as follows:

1. **DESIGN**

1.1. Developer shall design and construct, at the Developer's sole expense, the water facilities and appurtenances required to serve the development in accordance with final District-approved plans known as **Ventana John Previti Ave (South Improvements)**, as approved and attached herein as <u>Exhibit "B"</u> and in accordance with District-approved design standards and specifications, and the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

1.2. The water system design shall be by a Professional Engineer registered in the State of California, and in accordance with the District's Rules and Regulations, latest edition (the "Rules and Regulations"), the District's Standards for Domestic Water Facilities and Standard Drawings herein included by reference, all applicable District ordinances and policies and all City, County, State of California, and Federal laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, codes and other legal requirements of all government bodies having jurisdiction over said construction and property (all of the foregoing requirements in this paragraph being collectively referred to herein at times as "Legal Requirements").

1.3. The District, at Developer's expense, shall review Developer's plans for the purpose of ensuring the adequacy of the design and conformance with the District's standards and specifications. The District reserves the right to add, delete, modify, change or amend any or all the plans and specifications.

1.4. In the event that the property to be developed includes multiple residential, condominiums, commercial or industrial uses, all site plans, grading plans, improvement plans, and any available plumbing plot plans shall be furnished to the District by Developer.

1.5. The District makes no warranties as to the correctness, accuracy or completeness of the plans and specifications. The accuracy, adequacy, suitability, and correctness of the water system design shall be the sole responsibility of the Developer.

2. CONSTRUCTION

2.1. Developer shall perform, or caused to be performed, all construction of the water system infrastructure installation pursuant to the approved water system plans, legal requirements, and other applicable requirements.

2.2 The performance of this Agreement shall commence within ninety (90) calendar days from the executed date of this Agreement and shall be completed within one (1) year from the estimated construction start date.

2.3. Time is of the essence in this Agreement; provided that, in the event good cause is shown therefore, the general manager of the District ("General Manager") may extend the time for completion of the water system installation. Any such extension may be granted without the notice to Developer's surety, and extensions so granted shall not relieve the surety's liability on the bond to secure faithful performance of this Agreement. The General Manager shall be the sole and final judge as to whether or not good cause has been shown to entitle Developer to an extension.

2.4. The Developer and its contractor and subcontractors shall attend a pre-construction meeting with the District no less than two (2) working days prior to commencement of construction.

2.5. No work on water facilities shall commence prior to the completion of all required curbs and gutters.

3. LICENSES AND PERMITS

3.1. Developer, and all of Developer's contractors and subcontractors warrants it possesses, or shall obtain, and maintain during the term of this Agreement any and all licenses, permits, qualifications, insurance and approval of whatever nature that are legally required of Developer, its contractors, and all subcontractors to practice its profession, skill or business.

3.2. The work to be performed under this Agreement, except meter installations by the District, shall be performed by Developer, or a contractor or subcontractor who is pre-approved by the District and is licensed under the laws of the State of California in the specialty Class of "C-34" Pipeline or Class "A" General Engineering. A copy of the contract between Developer and the selected pre-approved contractor and all subcontractors shall be submitted to the District for review and approval attached herein as <u>Exhibit "C"</u>.

3.3. Excavation/resurfacing permits shall be secured by Developer at Developer's expense. Permits/easements to install, maintain and operate water system facilities in private property shall be secured by Developer at Developer's sole expense prior to construction.

3.4. Developer shall, at Developer's sole expense, be responsible for obtaining and adhering to a National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit from the Regional Water Quality Board as required for construction or pipeline flushing and disinfection.

3.5 Developer shall, at Developer's sole expense, be responsible for obtaining and adhering to the California Environmental Quality Act.

4. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

4.1. The following insurance requirements have been adopted by the District and shall be applicable to this Agreement. These requirements supersede the insurance requirements set forth in any other reference of the District, and to the extent of any conflict, the specified requirements herein shall prevail.

4.2. Developer shall ensure that Developer's contractors conform to the following insurance requirements and that all required documents are submitted to the District at the time of Agreement submittal: Developer shall ensure that its contractors and all subcontractors shall purchase and maintain insurance in amounts equal to the requirements set forth in (a) through (d) below, and shall not commence work under this Agreement until all insurance required under this heading is obtained in a form acceptable to the District, nor shall Developer allow any contractor or subcontractor to commence construction pursuant to a contract or subcontract until all insurance required of the contractor and any subcontractors has been obtained.

a. <u>General Liability</u>: Developer shall ensure that its contractor and all subcontractors shall maintain during the life of this Agreement, a standard form of either Comprehensive General Liability insurance or Commercial General Liability insurance ("General Liability Insurance") providing the following minimum limits of liability: Combined single limit of \$1.0 million per occurrence for bodily injury, including death, personal injury, and property damage with \$2.0 million minimum aggregate, separate for this project as evidenced by endorsement. The insurance shall include coverage for each of the following hazards: Premises-Operations; Owners and Contractors Protective; Broad Form Property Damage contractual for Specific Contract; Severability of Interest or Cross-Liability; XCU Hazards; and Personal Injury – With the "Employee" Exclusive Deleted.

b. <u>Automotive/Vehicle Liability Insurance</u>: Developer shall ensure that its contractor and all subcontractors shall maintain a policy of automotive/vehicle liability insurance on a commercial auto liability form covering owned, non-owned and hired automobiles providing the following minimum limits of liability: Combined single limit of liability of \$1.0 million per accident for Bodily Injury, Death and Property Damage ("Automotive/Vehicle Liability Insurance").

c. <u>Workers' Compensation Insurance</u>: Developer shall ensure that its contractor and all subcontractors shall provide such workers' compensation insurance with statutory minimum amounts of coverage, as required by the California *Labor Code* and other applicable law, and including employer's liability insurance with a minimum limit of \$1,000,000.00 ("Workers' Compensation Insurance"). Such Workers' Compensation Insurance shall be endorsed to provide for a waiver of subrogation against the District. d. <u>Excess Liability</u>: Developer shall ensure that its contractor and all subcontractors shall provide a policy providing excess coverage in a face amount necessary when combined with the primary insurance, to equal the minimum requirements for General Liability Insurance and Automotive/Vehicle Liability Insurance.

4.3. The insurances provided for in Section 4.2 and its subsections above are subject to all of the following conditions:

a. The insurance shall be issued and underwritten by insurance companies acceptable to the District, and shall be licensed by the State of California to do business on the lines of insurance specified. The insurers must also have an "A-" Policyholder's rating" and a "financial rating" of at least Class VII in accordance with the most current A.M. Best's Rating Guide.

b. Developer's contractor and subcontractors may satisfy the limit requirements in a single policy or multiple policies. Any such additional policies written as excess insurance shall not provide any less coverage than that provided by the first or primary policy.

c. Any costs associated with a self-insured program, deductibles, or premium rating programs that determine premium based on loss experience shall be for the account of Developer, Developer's contractor and subcontractors, and the District shall not be required to participate in any such loss. If any such programs exist, Developer, Developer's contractor and subcontractors, agree to protect and defend the District in the same manner as if such cost provisions were not applicable.

d. Developer shall ensure that its contractor and all subcontractors shall have presented at the time of execution of the Agreement, the original policies of insurance and a certificate of insurance naming the District as the certificate holder and that such coverage is in force and complies with the terms and conditions outlined herein.

e. If an insurance policy contains a general policy aggregate of less than the minimum limits specified, then the policy coverage shall be written with limits applicable solely to this Agreement, as specified, and shall not be reduced by or impaired by any other claims arising against Developer. These policy limits shall be set forth by separate endorsement to the policy.

4.4. Each such policy of General Liability Insurance and Automotive/Vehicle Liability Insurance shall contain endorsements providing the following:

a. The District, their board members, officers, agents, employees, consultants, and engineers, are hereby declared to be additional insureds under the terms of this policy, but only with respect to the operations of the Developer at or upon any of the premises of the District in connection with the Agreement with the District, or acts or omissions of the additional insureds in connection with, but limited to its general supervision or inspection of said operations and save for any claims arising from the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct the District.

b. No policy shall be canceled, limited, materially altered, or non-renewed by the insurer until thirty (30) days after receipt by the District of a written notice of such cancellation or reduction in coverage.

c. This insurance policy is primary insurance and no insurance held or owned by the designated additional insureds shall be called upon to cover a loss under this policy.

5. BONDING REQUIREMENTS

5.1. Developer shall obtain a cost proposal for the approved water improvement plans from a pre-approved Contractor attached herein as <u>Exhibit "C"</u>. The cost proposal will be submitted to the District for review and approval, and shall be used as the basis for bonding requirements for the water system described in the plans provided to the District by the Developer and approved for construction by the District.

5.2. <u>Performance Bond:</u> The cost proposal for the water system improvements for **Ventana John Previti Ave (South Improvements)**, is (DEVELOPER TO PROVIDE AT LATER DATE) no/100 dollars (DEVELOPER TO PROVIDE AT LATER DATE). Developer shall and by this Agreement does guarantee the Developer's faithful performance of this Agreement and all of its terms and conditions by providing the following: Developer shall provide the District with a performance bond, from a surety institution licensed by the State of California and authorized to do and doing business in said State, valid and renewable until such improvements are accepted by the District. The performance bond attached herein at <u>Exhibit "D"</u>, shall be in the amount of (DEVELOPER TO PROVIDE AT LATER DATE) equal to 100 percent of the cost proposal.

5.3. <u>Warranty Bond</u>: The pre-approved Contractor shall furnish a two-year warranty bond for all work completed in accordance with the approved water improvement plans attached herein as <u>Exhibit "B"</u>. Before District's acceptance of the completed water facilities and appurtenances, such facilities and appurtenances shall be free from any and all liens and encumbrances and free from any and all defects in the materials or construction thereof. The two-year warranty shall be a warranty bond beginning on the date of acceptance of the water facilities by the District and shall be in the amount of (DEVELOPER TO PROVIDE AT LATER DATE) equal to 100 percent of the Contractor's cost proposal.

6. MATERIALS

6.1. The water system facilities to be installed pursuant to this Agreement shall become an extension of the distribution system of the District. All materials used must conform to District specifications for such materials pursuant to all applicable legal requirements.

7. NOTICES

7.1. All notices herein required shall be in writing, and delivered in person or sent by registered mail, postage prepaid.

7.2. Notices required shall be given to the **District** addressed as follows:

WEST VALLEY WATER DISTRICT Attn: General Manager Post Office Box 920 Rialto, CA 92377 *RE:* Ventana John Previti Ave (South Improvements)

7.3. Notices required shall be given to **Developer** addressed as follows:

DEVELOPER NAME: ATTN TO: ADDRESS *RE:* Ventana John Previti Ave (South Improvements)

7.4. Notices required shall be given to Surety addressed as follows: SURETY NAME: ATTN TO: ADDRESS *RE:* Ventana John Previti Ave (South Improvements)

7.5. Provided that any party or Surety may change such address by notice in writing to the other party, and thereafter, notices shall be addressed and transmitted to the new address.

7.6. The Developer or its contractor shall provide the District forty-eight (48) hours advance notice of request for inspection or testing.

8. NOTICE TO PROCEED TO CONSTRUCT WATER SYSTEM FACILITIES

8.1. Upon acceptance of the insurance and aforementioned bonds in the amounts provided herein and approval by the District and upon payment of all applicable charges, the Agreement shall be signed by Developer and the District. The District shall return an original copy of the signed Agreement with a letter to Developer giving notice to proceed to construct the water system facilities.

9. INSPECTION

9.1. It is understood that the sole purpose and intent of the District's inspection and testing is to validate that the materials, workmanship, and construction of the water facilities are in compliance with the District-approved final plans, the District's Rules and Regulations, the Standards for Domestic Water Facilities, the Standard Drawings, and all other applicable District requirements. Developer acknowledges and represents that it assumes full and sole responsibility for the safety and management of the project.

9.2. Developer shall at all times maintain proper facilities and provide safe access for inspection by the District to all parts of the work and to the shops wherein the work is in preparation. Additionally, in connection with the performance of this Agreement, the District shall have the authority to enter the work site at any time for the purpose of identifying the existence of conditions, either actual or threatened, that may present a danger of hazard to any and all employees. Developer agrees that the District, in its sole authority and discretion, may order the immediate abatement of any and all conditions that may present an actual or threatened danger or hazard to any and all employees at the work site. Furthermore, Developer acknowledges the provisions of California *Labor Code* Section 6400 et seq., which requires that employees shall furnish employment and a place of employment that is safe and healthful for all employees working therein. In the event the District identifies the existence of any condition that presents an actual or threatened danger or hazard to any or all employees at the work site, the District is hereby authorized to order an immediate abatement of that condition.

9.3. All work and materials shall be subject to inspection, testing, and acceptance by the District at Developer's expense. In the event Developer arranges to have materials fabricated for the project, Developer may be required to arrange for the District to inspect that material during fabrication at Developer's expense.

9.4. All material fabrications shall be preapproved by the District and must conform to District standards and specifications.

9.5. The District's inspectors shall have full, unlimited access to perform continuous inspection and have the authority to stop work at any time, by written notice or verbal notice followed by written notice within three (3) working days, without any liability whatsoever to the District, if, in the inspectors' judgment, the work called for by this Agreement, or the District approved plans, or the specifications is not being installed or performed in a satisfactory and workmanlike manner according to District's standards and specifications and/or in the event the materials do not comply with the District's standards and specifications.

9.6. The Developer shall be responsible for insuring the pre-approved contractor performs work with District inspection. If work is done without District inspection, the Contractor shall be responsible for exposing any portion of work as directed by the District at their sole expense. The District will not provide permanent water services until all required inspections are completed and any requirements set forth by the District have been satisfied.

9.7 Final acceptance of all material to be purchased or fabricated by Developer under this Agreement shall be made only with the prior approval of the District. Approval by the District, however, shall not operate to relieve the material supplier or Developer of any guarantees, warranties, or the duty of compliance with any of the requirements of the approved plans and specifications or of this Agreement. All construction pursuant to this Agreement shall be inspected pursuant for conformity with District requirements. Developer shall pay actual costs for inspections.

10. TESTING AND DISINFECTION

10.1. All water system facilities and components constructed pursuant to this Agreement shall adhere to all requirements for testing, disinfection, and flushing pursuant to District standards and Legal Requirements.

11. RELOCATIONS, RECONSTRUCTIONS, AND DAMAGES

11.1. Developer accepts the responsibility for and the costs occasioned by any reconstruction, relocation, damages to, or changes of water services or facilities caused or contributed to directly or indirectly by any subsequent changes in the location of any of said facilities or water meters or water services.

12. AS-CONSTRUCTED DOCUMENTATION

12.1. In order for the District to accept the facilities, Developer shall provide all required documentation as specified in the Standards for Domestic Water Facilities, including as-built drawings.

13. INDEMNIFICATION

13.1. Developer hereby agrees to and shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold the District and its board members, officers, agents, employees, and engineers free and harmless from any and all liability losses, damages, claims, liens, demands and cause of action of every kind and character including, but not limited to, the amounts of judgments, penalties, interests, court costs, attorney's/legal fees, and all other expenses incurred by the District arising in favor of any party, including claims, liens, debts, demands for lost wages or compensation, personal injuries, including employees or the District, death or damages to property (including property of the District) and without limitation by enumeration, all other claims or demands of every character occurring or in any way incident to, in connection with or arising directly or indirectly out of the obligations herein undertaken or out of the operations conducted by Developer save and except claims or litigation arising through the sole negligence or sole willful misconduct of the District or the District's agents and employees. Developer shall investigate, handle, respond to, provide defense for and defend any such claims, demand, or suit at the sole expense of Developer even if the claim or claims alleged are groundless, false or fraudulent. Developer agrees to, and shall defend the District and its members, directors, officers, agents, employees, and engineers from any suits or actions at law or in equity for damages caused, or alleged to have been caused, by reason of any of the aforesaid operations, provided as follows:

a. That the District does not and shall not waive any rights against Developer which it may have by reason of the aforesaid hold harmless agreement, because of the acceptance by the District, or the deposit with District by Developer, or any of the insurance policies described in this Agreement.

b. That the aforesaid hold harmless agreement by Developer shall apply to all damages and claims for damages of every kind suffered, or alleged to have been suffered, by reason of any or the aforesaid operations referred to in this subsection, regardless of whether or not District has prepared, supplied water system installation, or regardless of whether or not such

insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any such damages or claims for damages.

This provision is not intended to create any cause of action in favor of any third party against Developer or the District or to enlarge in any way Developer's liability but is intended solely to provide for indemnification of the District from liability for damage or injuries to third persons or property arising from Developer's performance hereunder.

13.2. Neither Developer nor any of Developer's agents, contractors or subcontractors are, or shall be, considered to be agents of the District in connection with the performance of Developer's obligations under this Agreement.

14. REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION OF DEFECTIVE WORK

14.1. If, within a period of two years after final acceptance of the work performed under this Agreement, any structure or part of any structure furnished and/or installed or constructed, or caused to be installed or constructed by Developer, or any of the work done under this Agreement, fails to fulfill any of the requirement of this Agreement or the specifications referred to herein, Developer shall, without delay and without any cost to District, repair or replace or reconstruct any defective or otherwise unsatisfactory part or parts of the work structure. Should Developer fail to act promptly or in accordance with this requirement, or should the exigencies of the situation as determined by the District in the exercise of its sole discretion require repair, replacement or reconstruction before Developer can be notified, District may, at its option, make the necessary repairs or replacements or perform the necessary work, and Developer shall pay to the District the actual cost of such repairs.

15. COSTS AND FEES

15.1. Developer shall be responsible for all fees and deposits as required by the District. All fees and deposits shall be paid in full before construction can take place as outlined in the billing letter (provided separately).

15.2. Any additional costs and fees shall be paid in full prior to conveyance and acceptance of the water system.

16. CONVEYANCE AND ACCEPTANCE OF WATER SYSTEM

16.1. Upon completion of the water system in accordance with the approved water plans and submission of the required documentation, the Developer shall convey the water system to the District.

16.2. The Developer shall be responsible for insuring the pre-approved contractor furnish a warranty bond (One Hundred (100%) of Contractor's cost proposal) for a period of two (2) years as stated in Sections 5.3 of this Agreement, as-built drawings with contractor redlines and AutoCAD files, materials list with quantities, water system cost breakouts, compaction test report signed and sealed by a California Registered Engineer, notice of completion filed with County Recorder's office, fire flow tests of all hydrants, all required easements for water facilities and unconditional financial release from subcontractors and material providers. Upon compliance

with all the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the District shall prepare the Bill of Sale accepting the water facilities and forward same to the address provided herein. Title to the ownership of said facilities and appurtenances shall thereby be conveyed to the District. The District shall thereafter operate and maintain said facilities so as to furnish water service to the development (Exhibit "A") in accordance with the District's ordinances, policies and Rules and Regulations.

17. PERMANENT WATER SERVICE

17.1. In no event shall permanent water services be provided to Developer's installed system until all applicable charges and fees have been paid by Developer and all facilities have been conveyed, free of all encumbrances, to the District, including any easements which may be required. Such conveyance shall occur in a timely manner in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

18. BREACH OR DEFAULT OF AGREEMENT

18.1. If Developer refuses or fails to obtain prosecution of the work, or any severable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time specified, or any extension thereof, or fails to obtain completion of said work within such time, or if Developer should be adjudged as bankrupt, or Developer should make a general assignment for the benefit of Developer's creditors, or if a receiver should be appointed in the event of Developer's insolvency, or if Developer, or any of Developer's contractors, subcontractors, agents or employees, should violate any of the provisions of this Agreement, the District's General Manager or the General Manager's designee may serve written notice upon Developer and Developer's surety of breach of this Agreement, or of any portion therefore, and default of Developer.

18.2. In the event of any such notice, Developer's surety shall have the duty to take over and complete the work and the improvement herein specified; provided, however, that if the surety, within five (5) days after the serving upon of such notice of breach, does not give the District written notice of its intention to take over the performance of the contract, and does not commence performance thereof within five (5) days after notice to the District of such election, District may take over the work and prosecute the same to completion, by contract or by any other method District may deem advisable, for the account and at the expense of Developer, and Developer's surety shall be liable to the District for any excess cost or damages occasioned District thereby; and, in such event, District, without liability for so doing, may take possession of, and utilize in completing the work, such materials, appliances, plant and other property belonging to Developer as may be on the site of the work and necessary therefore.

19. SUCCESSORS BOUND

19.1. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the parties and their respective legal representatives, successors, heirs, and assigns.

20. ENFORCEMENT OF PROVISIONS

20.1. The District's failure to enforce any provisions of this Agreement or the waiver thereof in any instance shall not be construed as a general waiver or relinquishment on its part of any such provision, but the same shall nevertheless be and remain in full force and effect.
