Celebrate Fix a Leak Week with WVWD

Mark your calendars! Fix a Leak Week is March 20 – 26, 2023 – but remember, you can find and fix leaks inside and outside your home to save valuable water and money all year long.

Fix a leak week brings awareness to household leaks that can waste nearly 1 trillion gallons of water nationwide. You can help save that water waste by fixing common leaks in your household, such as a faucet or a running toilet. Here are some quick tips on how you can participate:

 *Leak Tip #1: Toilets are the most common culprit of water leaks. You may not realize it, but when you hear water running in your toilet, that means that the water is going straight to the drain. So, unless you're flushing the toilet, it shouldn't make any sounds.*

 *Leak Tip #2: Check for pooling water under the pipes and rust around joints and edges.*

 *Leak Tip #3: Look for drips near the showerhead joints or stray sprays that can be stopped with tape.*

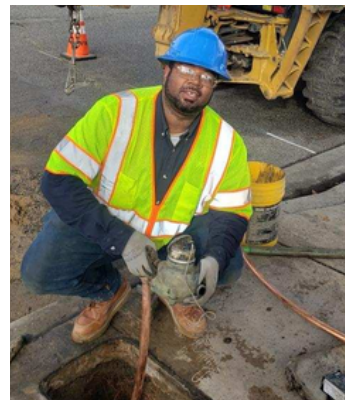
"I was looking for a career that provided job stability and allowed me to contribute to my community. For me, a career in water checked off all the boxes," Matthew said.
