West Valley Water District (WVWD) encourages its customers to celebrate Smart Irrigation Month by implementing efficient irrigation practices and saving water outdoors.



Customers can help conserve water by checking their sprinklers for leaks and taking advantage of WVWD rebates, such as "Smart Weather Based Irrigation Controllers" that track current weather conditions and will turn off or reduce irrigation if precipitation is present or irrigation is not needed. The rebate amount for a qualifying smart timer is \$100.
